KOREA ~ THE NEVER DECLARED FORGOTTEN WAR

The **Korean War** was a war between the Republic of Korea (South Korea), supported by the United Nations, and the Democratic People's Republic of Korea (North Korea), supported by the People's Republic of China. It was primarily the result of the political division of Korea by an agreement of the victorious Allies at the conclusion of the end of World War II. The Korean Peninsula was ruled by the Empire of Japan from 1910 until the end of World War II. Following the surrender of the Empire of Japan in September 1945, American administrators divided the peninsula along the 38th parallel, with U.S. military forces occupying the southern half and Soviet military forces occupying the northern half.

On June 25, 1950, the Communist forces of North Korea, with backing from the Soviet Union, invaded South Korea. President Harry S. Truman ordered American troops to the Korean peninsula where they were soon joined by soldiers from 15 other United Nations member countries. This operation is officially referred to as the "Korean Conflict".

Suddenly the Cold War was a lot hotter. Things got really bad when the Chinese joined on the side of North Korea. After three years, the fighting ended with the signing of an armistice on July 27, 1953. There was no victor. War was never officially declared. Peace was never declared.

The country remained divided. And the Korean conflict was soon pushed off the front pages by events in a place called Vietnam.

This year will mark the 50th anniversary of the war's end.

Casualties of the Korean War

The United States Armed Forces suffered 33,665 Americans killed in action in Korea; 3,275 died there from non-hostile causes. *TOTAL: 36,940 Americans gave their lives in the Korean Theater.

There were 92,134 Americans wounded in action in 103,284 incidents. A total of 1,789,000 Americans served in the Korean theater during the Korean War from June 25, 1950 to July 27, 1953.

There are still 7,979 MIAs as of February, 2012, according to VFW Magazine

South Korea sustained 1,312,836 military casualties, including 415,004 dead; casualties among other United Nations allies totaled 16,532, including 3,094 dead.

Estimated Communist casualties were 2 million. The economic and social damage to the Korean nation was incalculable.
